Children's Disability Living Allowance (DLA)

Disability Living Allowance (DLA) for children may help with the extra costs of looking after a child who:

- is under 16
- has difficulties walking or needs much more looking after than a child of the same age who does not have a disability

They will need to meet all the eligibility requirements.

The DLA rate is between £23.70 and £152.15 a week and depends on the level of help the child needs.

NYCC Blue Badge / Bus pass

You're eligible for a blue badge without further assessment if you:

- are registered as blind;
- get the higher rate of the mobility component of Disability Living Allowance (DLA);
- get Personal Independence Payment (PIP) and scored eight points or more in the 'moving around' area of your assessment - check your decision letter if you're not sure:
- get War Pensioners' Mobility Supplement;
- received a lump sum payment as part of the Armed Forces Compensation scheme (tariffs 1 to 8), and have been certified as having a permanent and substantial disability; or
- have a hidden disability and experience very considerable difficulty whilst walking, which may include very psychological distress; or be at risk of serious harm when walking; or pose, when walking, a risk of serious harm to any other person. Discretionary housing payment

The Discretionary Housing Fund is designed to provide short-term support for exceptional and unforeseen pressures that means that someone on Housing Benefit can't pay their rent. The person affected might be suffering poor health or facing financial issues, and this limited fund can help those in this position.

If you are receiving Housing Benefit or the housing element of Universal Credit and you are struggling to pay your rent then you may qualify for a Discretionary Housing Payment (DHP).

DHPs cannot pay for things like water rates or fuel charges that may be included in your rent.

Warm home discount scheme

You could get £140 off your electricity bill for winter 2021 to 2022 under the Warm Home Discount Scheme. The money is not paid to you it's a one-off discount on your electricity bill, between October and March.

You may be able to get the discount on your gas bill instead if your supplier provides you with both gas and electricity. Contact your supplier to find out.

There are 2 ways to qualify for the Warm Home Discount Scheme:

- you get the Guarantee Credit element of Pension Credit - known as the 'core group'
- you're on a low income and meet your energy supplier's criteria for the scheme known as the 'broader group'
